Effect of default	 In case of non-fulfilment of RPO by obligated entities, said entities may be asked by the Commission to depositan amount into a separate fund created and maintained by the obligated entity. The amount of deposit shall be determined on the basis of shortfall in RPO and forbearance price. The fund shall be utilized by order of the Commission for purchase of certificates or for promoting renewable energy in the state.
